The Syracuse/Onondaga County Youth Bureau, a division of the Onondaga County Department of Children and Family Services, has been publishing the Directory for over 30 years. Our first version had just about half the number of pages as this current version, which shows how services for youth have grown and expanded throughout the County. While some of the original organizations are still listed, many are newly added.

This directory is meant as a general inventory of programs for children and youth; it may be utilized by families, service providers, friends, and youth themselves. The services in this directory are provided in the community and are accessible to young people meeting program criteria provided the service has adequate capacity. The services listed do not require a referral from a physician or mental health provider, nor will the services listed require referral from child welfare or juvenile justice systems or from the court system. If you are looking for services for children/youth with severe emotional and/or behavior problems, we recommend that you contact the ACCESS Line.

Program Description: The program currently offers medication-assisted therapy with the use of methadone

and is presently exploring the integration of buprenorphine within the OTP, though Crouse does currently offer Buprenorphine Medication Assisted Therapy (BMAT) within its service line. Medication-assisted therapy has proven most beneficial for

those who wish to remain abstinent from illicit opioids. The treatment plan addresses all addictions, medical issues, psychiatric issues and psychosocial problems. Counseling and medication are provided according to state and federal regulations, as well as the individual needs of the patient. Upon discharge, aftercare

is established by referral.
