The first hearing will be held Tuesday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> from 1:00 P.M. to 2:30 P.M. at the Magnarelli Community Center at McChesney Park. The second hearing will be held on Wednesday October 23<sup>rd</sup> from 1:00 P.M. to 2:30 P.M. at the Clay Town Hall located at 4401 State Route 31, Clay, N.Y. 13041.
