Pest management





Asthma Education and Action Plan!

GREEN ZONE: GO!	Take These DAILY CONTROLLER MEDICINES (PREVENTION) Medicines EVERY DAY
You have ALL of these: Breathing is easy No cough or wheeze Can work and play Can sleep all night	□ No daily controller medicines required □ Daily controller medicine(s): □ Take puff(s) or tablet(s) daily. □ For asthma with exercise, ADD: puffs with spacer minutes before exercise ALWAYS RINSE YOUR MOUTH AFTER USING YOUR DAILY INHALED MEDICINE.
YELLOW ZONE: CAUTION!	Continue DAILY CONTROLLER MEDICINES and ADD QUICK-RELIEF Medicines
You have ANY of these: Cough or mild wheeze Tight chest Shortness of breath Problems sleeping, working, or playing	Take daily controller medicine if ordered and add this quick-relief medicine when you have breathing problems:
RED ZONE: EMERGENCY!	Continue DAILY CONTROLLER MEDICINES and QUICK-RELIEF Medicines and GET HELP!
You have ANY of these: Very short of breath Medicine is not helping Breathing is fast and hard Nose wide open, ribs showing, can't talk well Lips or fingernails are grey or bluish	Take puffs every hours, if needed. Always use a spacer, some children may need a mask. nebulizer mg / ml Take a nebulizer treatment every hours, if needed. Other CALL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AGAIN WHILE GIVING QUICK-RELIEF MEDICINE. If health care provider cannot be contacted, CALL 911 FOR AN AMBULANCE OR GO DIRECTLY TO THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT!








