- March is Colorectal cancer awareness month. Colon cancer is the second most common cause of cancer death among men and women combined; however many people are NOT getting the appropriate screening. With screening, colon cancer can actually be prevented.
- The national percentage of adults 50 and older that are up to date with recommended colorectal cancer screening is 65 percent in 2010. In New York State, 69.3 percent have been screened; and in Onondaga County, that number is 75.3 percent.
- In an effort to change these figures and increase screening to save lives, several organizations across Central NY
 have joined the American Cancer Society and the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable in an 80 percent by
 2018 pledge we will do what we can to increase screening to 80 percent in the next two years.
- Signing on to this pledge at an event next week are organizations like the YMCA, Upstate Medical University, Crouse Hospital, and Onondaga County.
- We are grateful to your commitment to save lives from this disease!

Jason - some additional info from our press release below for reference if you need it.

"While a combination of earlier detection and better treatments have yielded a steady decline in the colorectal cancer death rate over the past 20 years, more than 1 in 3 adults in the United States who fall within recommended screening guidelines are still not being tested for colorectal cancer. That means the risk continues, and people who need treatment may not be getting it," said Alvaro Carrascal, vice president health systems with the American Cancer Society. "The good news is that screening can help find and prevent colorectal cancer."

"80% by 2018" is a NCCRT initiative in which over 650 organizations to date have committed to substantially reducing colorectal cancer as a major public health problem and are working toward the shared goal of 80% of adults aged 50 and older being regularly screened for colorectal cancer by 2018. Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the U.S. when men and women are combined, and a cause of considerable suffering among more than 134,000 adults diagnosed with colorectal cancer each year in the U.S. When adults get screened for colorectal cancer, it can be detected early at a stage when treatment is most likely to be successful, and in some cases, it can be prevented through the detection and removal of precancerous polyps. According to a study co-authored by American Cancer Society epidemiologist Ahmedin Jemal, if we can achieve 80% by 2018, 277,000 cases and 203,000 colorectal cancer deaths would be prevented by 2030.



Dear Chairman McMahon and members of the Onondaga County Legislature,

I am writing to you on behalf of the board of directors and members of the Onondaga Audubon Society regarding Onondaga County's plan to build the Lakeview Point Landing along the eastern edge of Lakeview Point. Onondaga Audubon is disappointed to learn that the landing is being approved using a negative declaration that will not allow for a complete environmental impact study. Although the construction of the landing and the access trail that will connect it to Lakeview Park will be an "enhancement to the existing wastebed cap", we feel it is structurally unsound to conclude that the project will not have a negative impact on the inhabitants of the wetlands located just to its south.



Volunteers from the Onondaga Lake Conservation Corps have planted large amounts of native vegetation and wildlife has already started to respond in a positive way to this change. Shorebirds, who migrate to and from the tundra to breed, have historically used the Onondaga Lake shoreline as a critical resting location. Last spring, a small group of American Avocets, migrating back to their western United States breeding grounds, were seen by workers along this site. (https://www.allaboutbirds.org/guide/American_Avocet/id)

The public survey portion of the F.O.C.U.S. on Onondaga Lake study from 2012 indicated that the largest percentage of respondents ranked "maintaining or reforesting the natural areas around the lake" as being of high importance. Since the west shore trail has already been constructed inland and above this region, its preservation would not conflict with the county's plan to loop the lake.

Onondaga Audubon's suggestion would be to continue closing off the access road of this area to public use (making it a permanent "authorized personnel only" road) and to perhaps create one or two viewing locations that would connect to the already existing west shore trail. This would allow people of Onondaga County the opportunity to view wildlife in the wetlands and shoreline area with minimal habitat disturbance. If additional funds are available (or a grant can be secured), educational signs and permanently fixed scopes might also be placed in these viewing areas.

Onondaga Audubon encourages the county legislature to consider designating this narrow shoreline/wetlands region to be of high environmental value to the lake's ecosystem and advocate for its protection and preservation.


WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation has offered the County \$1,110 for the property and easement, based upon an appraisal; and

RESOLUTION DATED MARCH 1, 2016

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REVISED PROJECT SCOPE IN CONNECTION WITH SEWER SEPARATION IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE ONONDAGA COUNTY SANITARY DISTRICT IN AND FOR SAID COUNTY

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 260 dated June 5, 1978, adopted pursuant to Section 11.82 of the Onondaga County Administrative Code, the County Legislature dissolved all existing Sanitary and Treatment Plant Districts of the County and established, as successor thereto, the Onondaga County Sanitary District, effective January 1, 1979; and

WHEREAS, on September 17, 1997, the County Legislature adopted Resolution No. 189-97 authorizing the County Executive to execute an Amended Consent Judgment (ACJ) in connection with the settlement of Atlantic States Legal Foundation, et al v. County of Onondaga; and

WHEREAS, the ACJ specifies capital projects and activities related to the attainment of effluent limitations and water quality objectives; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature has duly approved and authorized the implementation of certain sewer separation projects in order to remediate the problems of combined sewer overflows which release raw sewage into tributaries of Onondaga Lake at an estimated maximum cost of \$15,000,000 on December 4, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature approved a \$5,000,000 increase to the estimated maximum cost on June 2, 2009 to include separation of CSO 051 and a \$5,000,000 increase to the maximum estimated cost for the separation of CSO 022 on July 6, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Water Environment Protection has requested that the County approve a modified scope of such project to expand the number of sewer separation projects and include the addition of green infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature duly adopted a resolution on February 2, 2016, calling a public hearing on the foregoing matter to be held in the Legislative Chambers in the County Court House, in Syracuse, New York on March 1, 2016 at 12:58 o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly published in the manner provided by law and proof thereof has been submitted to this County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at the time and place aforesaid, at which all persons interested were heard; and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature has given due consideration to the evidence given at said public hearing; now, therefore be it



RESOLVED, by the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:


<u>Section 1.</u> Based upon the proceedings heretofore had and taken, it is hereby found and determined that it is necessary and in the public interest to undertake the proposed improvements described in the preambles hereof, and that said improvements will be of special benefit to all of the real property included within the limits of the District.

<u>Section 2.</u> A certified copy of this resolution shall be recorded in the office of the County Clerk and when so recorded shall be presumptive evidence of the regularity of the determinations herein contained. The clerk of the County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of such recording to be published once in the official newspaper of said County in the manner provided by law.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.


WHEREAS, it is now desired to amend said bond resolutions to modify the scope of the project to include additional sewer separation projects and green infrastructure; now, therefore be it

WHEREAS, currently, Onondaga County is at a 75.3% local screening rate; with a little outreach and awareness we can reach 80% by 2018, prevent more cancers and save lives; now, therefore be it

MEMORIALIZING THE SUPPORT OF THIS ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE FOR NEW YORK STATE TO AMEND THE LABOR LAW AND ESTABLISH AN HOURLY MINIMUM WAGE OF FIFTEEN DOLLARS

WHEREAS, in the world's wealthiest country, millions of full-time workers continue to earn poverty-level wages, endangering their own health and the health and futures of their children because of (among other things) poor nutrition, unsafe or inadequate housing, lack of access to medical care, and challenges to children's learning abilities; and

WHEREAS, a national movement of workers is demanding \$15 per hour as a minimum wage to support the actual costs of living; and

WHEREAS, this issue is not just about young people and summer part-time jobs, according to a survey conducted for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics which determined that more than half of all minimum wage workers are over the age of 25, thirty percent of those are over the age of 34 and twenty percent are over the age of 44; and

WHEREAS, studies show that an increase in the minimum wage corresponds with an increase in jobs and has little or no negative effect on the employment of minimum wage workers, regardless of the strengths or weakness in the economy, and that an increase in the minimum wage could generate billions of dollars in new consumer spending, adding a needed stimulus to the American economy; and

WHEREAS, polls also show that the majority of Americans support raising the minimum wage, including polls such as the 2012 study by Lake Research showing that 73 percent of Americans favor it, including 74 percent of independents and 50 percent of Republicans, crossing all demographic, regional and political categories; and a 2013 Pew Research Center poll with similar findings; and

WHEREAS, many leading economists in the United States also support an increase in the minimum wage for the good of the country, based on sound research; and

WHEREAS, an hourly minimum wage at \$15 will get families closer to a level where they can sustain themselves so that fewer people will need government assistance for housing, food and health care, and this Onondaga County Legislature finds that such will be for the benefit of all the County's residents and taxpayers; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby memorializes its support for New York State to enact legislation amending the Labor Law to establish an hourly minimum wage of at least \$15 for all workers within Onondaga County and to provide a mechanism whereby such minimum wage will be raised annually in an amount equal to the percentage increase of the Consumer Price Index for the immediately preceding year; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Onondaga County Legislature is hereby directed to cause a copy of this resolution to be transmitted to the Governor of New York State, to the Commissioner of Labor, and to the several legislators representing Onondaga County at the state level.
